#### What to ask: **Admissions Tutors**

 Note. They could be your interviewer; sound intrigued and don't ask really simple questions such as how long the course is or if it's PBL or traditionally taught – it will be in their prospectus online.

• Note. Ask whatever you like here – even if you think it's a 'silly question'. You will get the best insights... and hints and tips of the process.
